ACS(I) is in existence since 1999. Its roots, however, go back to the last quinquennium of the 20th century when it was formed by the merger of two national bodies representing cutaneous surgeons in the country - the Association of Dermatologic Surgeons of India (ADSI)* and the Indian Academy of Cutaneous Surgeons (IACS)**, established in 1995 and 1996 respectively.




EC meeting on 14.9.21, 21.12.21, 1.2.22, 31.5.22 ACSICON 2022 meeting 10.3.22, 21.4.22

The official APP of ACS(I) is planned to be launched during ACSICON 2022 for smooth transmission of information to the members and also easy handling of new member applications.
















ACS(I) ONLINE EC MEETING HELD ON 14TH SEPT 2021

The meeting started with welcome address by Dr Shyamanta Barua, President ACSI.

- 1. Decision on ACSI bank account
- i) A new account will be made at Bhubaneswar after all formalities are over in discussion with the earlier EC
- ii) A New working address: This needs to be finalised for easier transfer of bank account which will be the ACSI National Secretariat 21-23 as well. A resolution for the same has to be passed as soon as possible.
- 2. Discussion on the retaining ACSI auditor
- i) Proposal to take quotation from the existing auditor and proposed IADVL auditor And the best offer has to be considered after due discussions with the Treasurer, Finance Committee, President and Secretary General.
 Dr Shashi Kumar to discuss with Mr Sanjay Lal and inform.
- 3. Hike in membership fees

MINUTES OF THE ACSI EC MEETING 31ST MAY 2022

Presided by Dr Shyamanta Barua

Members participated include Dr Shahanas, Dr Manas, Dr Jagdish, Dr Swapnil, Dr Debjit, Dr Sashikumar, Dr Anal, Dr Jaishree, Dr Anal and Dr Remadevi

First topic taken up was regarding the Chairperson of the next Acsi conference. Dr Saoji resigned from the post of chairperson. Dr Riswan has agreed to be the chair person. Dr Swapnil said that the organizing committee of the conference is eagerly waiting for the venue inspection by the Acsi.

2 venues were suggested. Inspection could be done after the CDSI conference.It was decided that only few members need to go for the inspection. A tentative date of 26th June was fixed.

CC meeting of ACSI was proposed to be held in July. Dr Manas suggested a workshop on Saturday and CC meet on Sunday. Suggested place of meeting included Bhubaneswar, Bangalore and Mumbai. Dr Sashi suggested an online meet for the CC since AGBM is to be held just 2 months later. Since the expenses of the Saturday workshop and Sunday meeting including the food and accommodation would be 7 to 8 lakhs ...all agreed to have an online meet on July 10th Sunday from 10 am to 3 pm. Dr Shehanaz spoke about the journal and the technical glitches associated with it being solved. Apparently about 200 articles have been received and approximately 100 were accepted. There will be 20 articles per issue. 60-70 percent original articles. It was decided to include case reports in the present journal itself. There will be no separate case report journal. Can probably increase the number of articles per issue and perhaps can issue supplements. Contract with Walter Kluwer was renewed in 2021.

Dr Shyamanta pointed out that we should send a mail to them. Dr Swapnil mentioned about inviting fresh reviewers for the journal. Dr Shahanas had discussed with Walter Kluwer to issue certificates to reviewers but they were not happy about it. ACSI members could opt for print copy or ejournal on the website.

ACSI prelim quiz was decided to be held on 10th July. the prelims would be online quiz for 1hour in the morning. Top 8 teams will be selected. Dr Manas suggested involving IPCA and their tech team. Dr Shyamanta suggested that a fixed amount could be given to the participants for travel and accommodation for the finals. Registration is complimentary. Dr Swapnil suggested cheque to be given on the day of quiz would be approximately 10000 per team. Dr Shyamanta asked Dr Manas to circulate the MOU in the EC group and after discussion in EC group, Dr Manas could talk to ipca. Regarding insurance proposed that after CDSI conference ACSI could talk with insurance providers



MOU with insurance providers to be put in group for discussion. Nagpur conference venue visit being finalized for 19th June and formal communication to be given to them. President Secretary and one vice president to go Regarding observership program official mail to all centers to ask them submit fresh application to be done before 10th June. Vitiligo Day cme to be conducted in Rourkela announced by Dr Debjit. Sponsors have agreed to give 75000 as royalty Dr Shyamanta suggested activities such as walkathon and cyclathon for vitiligo day Dr Swapnil suggested posting photos/videos of vitiligo surgery at pan India level Dr Manas said there could be tie up with Pharma for publishing these photographs Dr Anal discussed the accounting of Acsi con Dr Shaymanta directed to close the existing account and to open a fresh account.

The average income from conference, journal expenses and average new membership per year were considered. After elaborate discussion the following were suggested

- 1. Membership fee can be increased to Rs.10,000/- from existing Rs.6,000/-
- 2. 18% GST shall be applicable on above fee.
- 3. Additional application processing fee shall be added on the above rates.
- 4. This shall be implemented from 1st April 2022.
- 5. 25% of the above fee shall be kept apart for JCAS.

REPORT ON Dermoscopy & Trichoscopy Workshop at Command Hospital Air Force Bangalore on 23 October 2021 under the aegis of ACS(I)

- 1. Introduction: Department of Dermatology Command Hospital Air Force Bangalore had organized a Dermoscopy & Trichoscopy Workshop on 23 October 2021 under the aegis of Association of Cutaneous Surgeons of India (ACSI).
- 2. Info of place/events: The workshop was organized at Sushruta auditorium, Command Hospital Air Force Bangalore between 4.30 pm and 8 pm and was followed by dinner at Air Force Officers' Mess, Trinity circle Bangalore.
- 3. Details of workshop: The workshop was attended by about 59 delegates and about 40 invited guests mostly comprising faculty members of various medical colleges and senior private practioners. Dr Manas Chatterjee, Dr Balachandra S Ankad and Dr Debdeep Mitra presented at workshop. The workshop began by welcome address by Dr Anuj Bhatnagar, Prof & HoD Dermatology, Command Hospital Air Force Bangalore and this was followed by auspicious lamp lighting and Saraswati Vandana. Proposal: Increase LM and PLM fees to Rs. 7000/-



How will it help ACS(I)?: With the onset of the pandemic, the revenue for ACS(I) is shrinking. The membership fee of Rs. 6000/- for LM & PLM is in place since 2019 and is very low compared to other Dermatology Associations in India and abroad. We propose a hike to Rs 7,000/- for both LM and PLM.

Constitution Committee opinion: Proposal can be taken up for discussion in AGBM. The Constitution mentions that a member will enjoy all the privileges of a life member by making a onetime payment of Indian Rs. 6000/- to be revised every three years by 15% increase after approval by AGBM. The last hike was done in April 2019. Therefore, the next hike can be implemented from next financial year (1st April 2022).

Discussion: Dr. Mysore agreed that there should be a hike in the fees but was not convinced that this marginal hike would be of much benefit. Dr. Reddy pointed out that as per constitution the maximum allowed hike can be 15% only. Dr. Shyamanta opined that the GB has the mandate to raise this 15% cap if it deems necessary. Dr. Shashikumar suggested to form a Committee to study the quantum of fees hike and then implement this.

Decision: It was decided that a committee of three Secretary Generals will be formed as per constitution and they will arrive at a final decision about the fee hike and it will be applicable from 1st April 2022 onwards.

The applicant can be made to pay the service charges alongwith the membership fees. Further, GST has to be paid on membership fees. This will help cut the revenue loss.

Reduction in number of JCAS print copies will be financially viable. Further, many members prefer e-copies rather than print copies. As per the new MoU with Wolters Kluwer we need to print a minimum of 900 copies. Therefore, we can reduce the number of print copies and help cut down costs. Moreover, paid print subscription can sustain the print journal.
